

# NSS Special Camp Report – Madsangvi

## A. Y. 2024-2025

The National Service Scheme (NSS) unit (D-SF-099) of GES Sir Dr. M. S. Gosavi College of Pharmaceutical Edu. And Res. Nashik organized 7 days Special Camp from 17<sup>th</sup> Jan 2025 to 23<sup>rd</sup> Jan, 2025 at Madsangvi, Dist- Nashik under the theme ‘Youth for MyBharat and Youth for Digital Literacy’

The brief report of 7 day camp is as follows.

### Day-1- 17<sup>th</sup> January 2025 (Inauguration of camp)

The inauguration of the NSS camp took place at the *Sabhagruh* in front of Maruti Mandir, Madsangvi. The event was graced by Sarpanch Mrs. Kalpanatai Kharat, Upasarpanch Sandipbhau Godse, and other members of the Gram Panchayat. The guests were welcomed by the College Principal, Dr. S. V. Amrutkar.

Dr. R. Y. Ghegade highlighted the achievements of previous camps and outlined the objectives for the upcoming seven days. Following this, Dr. Amrutkar emphasized the role of youth in nation-building and provided an overview of NSS history. Later, students conducted a village survey to gather essential data.





**Day 2 - 18<sup>th</sup> January 2025- (Cleanliness of Village)**

Students arrived at 7:00 AM and took the daily NSS pledge, followed by breakfast. They then visited *Smashan Bhumi* (crematorium) and cleaned the premises, as well as the area near the Gram Panchayat.

At 1:00 PM, students had lunch, followed by an insightful session by a resource person. The session focused on personal and social development, which students listened to attentively. Later, students engaged in activities such as choreographing a dance for school children and preparing slogans on social awareness.





**Day 3 - 19<sup>th</sup> January 2025- (Interaction with School students)**

The day began with the NSS pledge and breakfast. Students then visited local temples and cleaned the surroundings. A group of students also visited the Zilla Parishad (ZP) School, where they sought permission from the headmaster to interact with students and educate them about digital literacy and health awareness. SPPU NSS area coordinator Dr. Lokesh Surana visited the camp and very happy to see the work done by student. He also through lights on various NSS scheme and activity conducted by NSS dept. of SPPU.

After lunch, a knowledge-sharing session was conducted. Later, students prepared a *Pathnatya* (street play) on digital literacy and continued working on slogans to spread awareness.





**Day 4 - 20<sup>th</sup> January 2025 (Survey and awareness for blood related activity)**

After their morning routine, students gathered for a rally to raise awareness among villagers about health and cleanliness. Volunteers personally visited households to conduct an anemia survey and informed residents about the upcoming health check-up camp scheduled for 22nd January. This camp would include blood group testing, hemoglobin (Hb) check-ups, and anemia awareness sessions.

In the afternoon, another knowledge-sharing session took place. Later, students analyzed the survey data and discussed their findings with Dr. Ghegade and Prof. Chikhale. Based on the survey, Dr. Ghegade suggested that students procure generic medicines for distribution to those in need.





**Day 5 - 21<sup>st</sup> January 2025 (Awareness about various Government Agricultural schemes)**

Students took the NSS pledge and had breakfast before being divided into groups to share information with villagers about *Krushki Card* and various government agricultural schemes. They also educated people about digital frauds, particularly the risks of sharing OTPs. Following this, students cleaned the ZP School premises and systematically arranged tiles in designated areas. They also organized and stored old materials properly. This work was highly appreciated by the school principal. After lunch, a knowledge-sharing session was conducted.





### Day 6 - 22<sup>nd</sup> January 2025- (Blood Donation Camp)

A blood donation and health check-up camp was jointly organized by Arpan Blood Bank Pvt. Ltd., Nashik, and the college. The camp included blood group testing, hemoglobin check-ups, and anemia awareness programs. The event was a great success, with the following outcomes:

- **22 blood bags collected**
- **167 blood group tests conducted**, including for ZP School students and *Dindi Varkari* (pilgrims)
- **150 hemoglobin tests performed**

After the successful drive, students had lunch.





**Day 7 - 23rd January 2025 (Valedictory with Digital Literacy Pathnatya and Anemia story)**

The valedictory ceremony was held at the village *Sabhagruh*, attended by Gram Panchayat members and other dignitaries. Dr. Ghegade presented a summary of the seven-day activities carried out by NSS volunteers. The students successfully raised awareness among villagers and school children through digital literacy sessions, *Pathnatya*, and a short documentary on anemia. The camp concluded with heartfelt appreciation from the Sarpanch, Upsarpanch, and community members. The bond formed between the students and villagers was evident, and the students' contributions were widely recognized.

Following lunch, a small picnic to Chamar Leni was organized under the guidance of Prof. Divya Ingale, Sakshi Wani, and Prof. Hemant Chikhale. A detailed report on the camp was prepared by the faculty members.

**The NSS camp at Madsangvi was a resounding success, reflecting the spirit of service, dedication, and community engagement.**
